Crosstalk is discouraged in our meeting. Crosstalk is defined as commenting on another person's share, directly addressing a speaker, or carrying on side conversations while the meeting is in progress. If you feel someone is being too explicit or inappropriate, please raise your hand and the secretary will intervene.		
Meeting lists as well as informational pamphlets are available free of charge. There is also our SLAA basic text available for \$18; however, this book is available to newcomers free of charge. Anyone interested in a book please see me after the meeting.		
If you are a newcomer and feel comfortable in doing so, please introduce yourself using only your first name so that we may welcome you. <i>[Pause]</i> Welcome! Would you like a newcomer's packet? <i>[If Newcomer's packets are requested]</i> A newcomer's packet will be passed around for people to voluntarily put their phone number on it.
